Voice. Treaty. Truth. were three key elements to the reforms set out in the <u>Uluru</u> <u>Statement from the Heart</u>. These reforms represent the unified position of First Nations Australians.

The true story of colonisation must be told, must be heard, must be acknowledged. But hearing this history is necessary before we can come to some true reconciliation, some genuine healing for both sides. And of course, this is not just the history of our First Peoples – it is the history of all of us, of all of Australia, and we need to own it. Then we can move forward together.
